ALCC was founded 27 years ago and provides free, immediate legal assistance to low-income people with HIV, assisting over 900 clients with 1,600 cases this past year alone. In early 2014, the organization expanded its work through two long-standing legal assistance programs that moved over to ALCC: one program assists people who are at risk of homelessness and the other provides legal help to children with disabilities and their families.
