Attention: SNAP Work Requirements for ABAWDs Temporarily Suspended During State of Emergency

The Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA) passed by the US Congress temporarily suspends work requirements for Able-Bodied Adults Without Dependents (or ABAWDs) during this state of emergency.

Starting April 1, 2020, the SNAP work requirement for ABAWDs will be temporarily suspended in <u>EVERY COUNTY IN ILLINOIS</u> (including Cook County and DuPage County.) No one should be required to work 80 hours in order to keep their SNAP.



It is currently unknown when/if the work requirement will be reinstated in Illinois.
